

Awards and Recognition

The JSSS will provide the following award and recognition opportunities for students, teachers and schools:

STUDENT AWARDS

Gordon Lott Memorial Award Award Criteria

1. Application for the award is open to any Alberta student graduating from any Alberta high school.
2. The award will be in the amount of \$500 plus a Certificate to the award recipient.
3. To be eligible for award consideration, the graduating student must:
 - a) have successfully completed a minimum of two safety courses (HCS 3000 and HCS 3010; or HCS 3000 and AGR 3000).
 - b) have earned a final mark of at least 75% in any pair of the two safety courses indicated in Criteria 3a.
 - c) submit a completed application form, together with a written or electronic visual presentation describing how the knowledge and skills they have gained from completing the two specified safety courses have increased their work place safety readiness and employability.
Note: The presentation may relate to the applicant's off-campus education placements or paid part-time employment.
 - d) Conduct an onsite interview with a local business relating to safety readiness (Check with teacher/instructor to determine if this particular activity could be used as a project course for credit)
4. A panel of judges, appointed by the JSSS, will assess all entries and make the award to the applicant whose presentation is judged best in describing the importance of health and safety education and how this education has impacted the applicant's workplace behaviours.

NOTE:

If, in the JSSS judges' opinion, no presentation meets the required standard, the award will not be made for that year.

Tim Hamilton Memorial Awards Awards Criteria

1. The awards (1st, 2nd and 3rd places) open to any student graduating from Forest Lawn High School Calgary.
2. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be in the amount of \$250, \$150 and \$100 respectively plus a Certificate to each award recipient.
3. To be eligible for award consideration, the graduating student must:
 - a) have successfully completed a minimum of two safety courses (HCS 3000 and HCS 3010; or HCS 3000 and AGR 3000).
 - b) have earned a final mark of at least 75% in any pair of the two safety courses indicated in Criteria 3a.
 - c) submit a completed application form, together with a written or electronic visual presentation describing how the knowledge and skills they have gained from completing the two specified safety courses have increased their work place safety readiness and employability.
Note: The presentation may relate to the applicant's off-campus education placements or paid part-time employment.
 - d) Conduct an onsite interview with a local business relating to safety readiness (Check with teacher/instructor to determine if this particular activity could be used as a project course for credit)
4. A panel of judges, appointed by the JSSS, will assess all entries and make the award to those applicants whose presentations are judged best, second best and third best, in describing the importance of health and safety education and how this education has impacted the applicant's workplace behaviours.

NOTE: If, in the JSSS judges' opinion, no presentation meets the required standard, one or more of the awards will not be made for that year.

TEACHER INSERVICE CREDENTIALLING OPPORTUNITIES

A. Teacher Completion of JSSS Inservices

The following inservice and credentialing opportunities will be available to teachers:

- 1) Teachers completing one or more of the following health and safety-related professional development courses will be credentialed by the JSSS:
 - Off-campus Education: Ensuring Due Diligence/Duty of Care
 - Off-campus Education: Workplace Inspections and Approval Processes
 - JobSafe in the Classroom and Beyond: The New Health and Safety Courses, HCS3000 and 3010 and AGR3000.

- 2) Teachers completing one or more of the Health and Safety Professional Development (ProD) modules currently under development will be recognized and credentialed. When all ProD modules have been developed, Pro-D focused inservices will be made available to teachers.

Note:

Inservice opportunities for teachers may be delivered locally (e.g. in their school) and/or in regional locations convenient to teachers from multiple school authorities and schools. A minimum registration of 10 participants is required for each inservice.

B. Teacher Excellence in Safety Course Instruction

Teachers submitting:

1. the highest total number of safety-related student course completions; and/or
2. students who have achieved excellence (100 percent) in a safety-related course

will be provided with opportunities to receive recognition at the JSSSS's annual Safe Youth Network Celebration and/or at a provincial occupational health and safety conference.

SCHOOL RECOGNITION OPPORTUNITIES

Schools submitting information to the JSSSS that results in their school having the highest number of students successfully completing groups of safety courses with a mark of 100% or higher in a course (e.g.: HCS 3000 and 3010 and/or AGR 3000) will be recognized with a JobSafe School Award plaque that can be updated annually with subsequent year awards.

- Applicants must submit a completed application form, together with a written statement (minimum one full 8 ½ X 11 page) or electronic visual presentation describing how the knowledge and skills they have gained from completing their named safety courses have increased their work place safety readiness and employability.
Note: The presentation may relate to the applicant's off-campus education placements, volunteered or paid part-time employment.
- Conduct an onsite interview with a local business relating to safety readiness (Check with teacher/instructor to determine if this particular activity could be used as a project course for credit)
